Parking safety concerns

We are receiving an increasing number of complaints from parents, neighbours, pedestrians and other road users about the unsafe dropping off and parking at the front of school by some parents. I know that student safety is of the upmost priority for all of us and as a school community: students, parents and staff, we need to work together to ensure that the road outside school is safe for all to use. Policing parking is not something that teaching and school staff can spend time on so I am reminding all parents politely, not to drop off or park in the middle of Haydn Road or on the marked area with yellow zig-zags outside of school. There is plenty of space further down Haydn Road where a student can be dropped off safely and walk for less than a minute to school. If this situation does not improve then we will have to take further steps by contacting parents individually who continue to park unsafely. However, I would prefer to spend staff time and resources on matters relating directly to education.

Curriculum News

Art

Year 7 have been learning all about portraiture this term and have created some brilliant monoprints in response to a war time artist called Kathe Kollwitz. They've been exploring how to evoke sad emotions through their work and expanding their vocabulary as well as learning a bit more about World War 2. Year 8 have just completed their fantastic mixed media final pieces - look out for some of those in our end of year exhibition!

Year 9 have made a fantastic start to their GCSE art and are working very hard both in and out of lessons - another talented cohort to look out for!

Year 10 continue to be fantastic, working hard and producing high quality work. Their next challenge in art is to find a theme to focus on for their coursework unit which will be worth 60% of their overall grade.

Year 11 Art GCSE have almost completed their coursework unit of their GCSE, which means 60% is almost done! They have done very well and created some lovely work ranging from digital editing of photographs to full A1 paintings. It has certainly been a challenging term for year 11 but they have faced it head on and have created some stunning work. 15 Y7 girls represented the school in the EFL tournament, last week. Their effort was exceptional and the B team came away with two wins, one draw and a loss. There was fantastic sportsmanship shown by all girls involved.

PSHCE

Year 7 have been learning about citizenship and the United Nations' rights of a child in their PSHE lessons this term; they have been looking at what makes a good member of the community. More recently they have also looked at the more serious topic of extremism and radicalisation, studying previous cases and learning about the signs that someone who is being radicalised might show. We have a very open forum for questions and discussions within PSHE lessons so that pupils feel they can ask questions openly but also mention any concerns that they might have.

Year 8 have been learning more about refugees and how to empathise with the situation that many refugee children find themselves in. Year 9 have been focusing on finance in the last few weeks in order to prepare them for the future, looking at bank accounts and how to manage a budget. Year 10 received a workshop from the city council to learn more about the law, sexting and realistic expectations. Year 11 have been using their PSHE lessons to look at what they want to do after GCSEs. They have been using a program called Unifrog; this is an amazing resource which helps pupils explore further education and apprenticeships and can be accessed at home as well as school. Year 11 have also been very busy with Sixth Form and college applications!

Spanish

In Spanish lessons this term, students have been working hard on practising the content of their knowledge organisers in a variety of ways, including using Kahoot, Quizlet and translation activities. They have also been building confidence in sharing mistakes and corrections they have made to their work, which has been successful in helping learners to make progress. Year 7 have been learning

about free time and school, whilst year 8 have been studying the topics of fashion and leisure. Year 9 have been learning to discuss school rules and extracurricular activities, whilst year 10 have been learning about cities. The year 11 mock speaking assessments went well overall and they have been finishing the GCSE course with the topic of the environment and global issues. Another successful term, well done and thank you for your continued commitment to vocabulary and grammar practice.

Christmas Concert
