I would like to start by wishing you all a Happy New Year and I hope that you all had a restful break over the Christmas period.

The end of term saw the launch of the assessment revision window alongside some fun end of term activities. 
We have received a large number of book donations for the library from students which we are very grateful for. If anyone has any old books they would like to donate we would still love to have them.
