Sixth Form



We are delighted to be able to launch our Sixth Form at Nottingham Free School, starting in September 2019. Our offer is for an A Level focused, supportive Sixth Form focused on ensuring all students get the best grades and wider development needed for university, apprenticeships and employment. We will be accepting applications online from our year 11 cohort and external candidates. completed, students are able to book an interview time as well. Interviews will take place from November to January.
